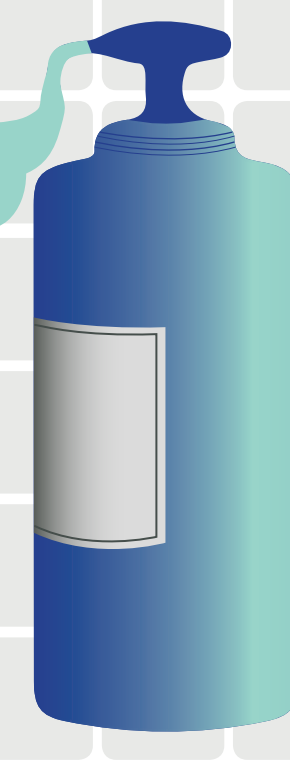
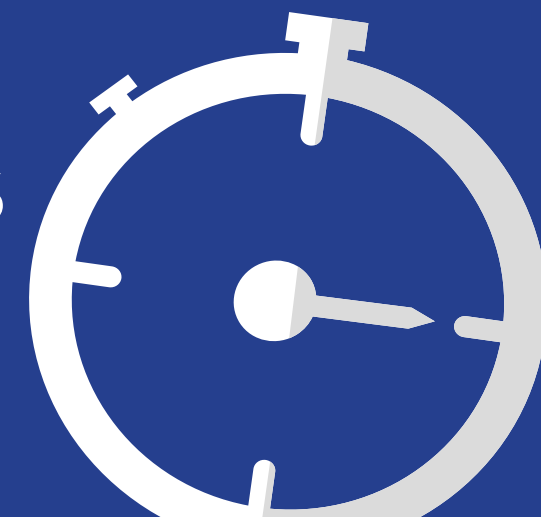

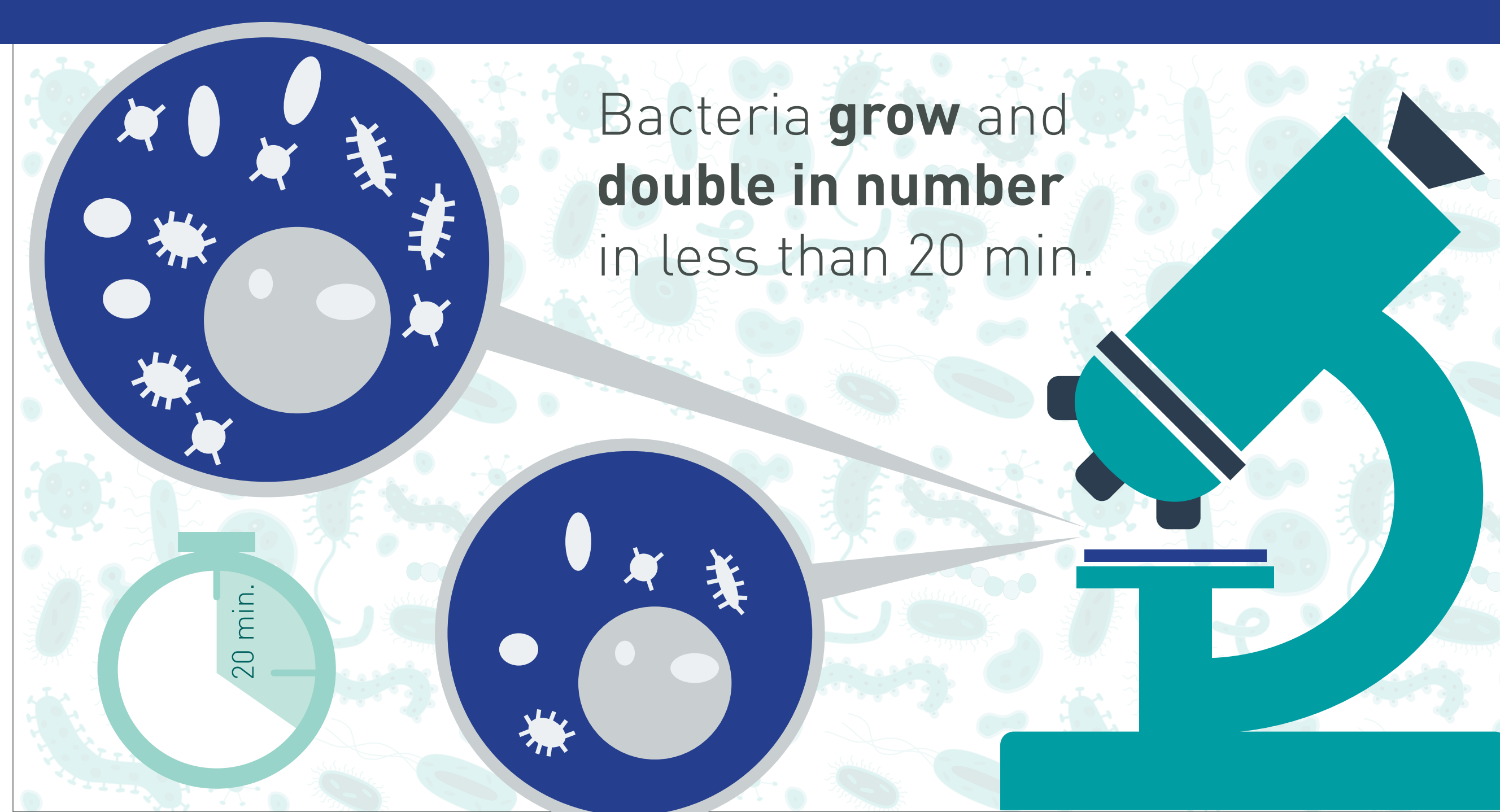
The average person washes their hands for around 10 seconds, when in fact they should wash them for a minimum of

Failure to **wash hands correctly** provides a risk...
